#### 2026 NAPLAN

NAPLAN testing for Years 7 and 9 will begin from Wednesday 11 March and will conclude by Monday 23 March. Students will complete the testing online working through 4 tests that will be spread out over the first 7 days of the testing window. If students are absent from a testing session a catchup will be organised where possible. Our school IT staff are currently ensuring the NAPLAN testing browser has been installed on student laptops to facilitate the testing and the school will provide headphones for students to use during the tests.

We would encourage all students to participate in the NAPLAN testing and to give each test their best possible attempt. It is important that parents remind their children that this is not a test to judge or grade them but rather to see what they know and comprehend. The testing is used to inform student progress and to inform staff as to where students are sitting in the four areas of Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language, and Numeracy. 


## Year 9 Biology

In Year 9 Biology this week, we conducted the practical 'Growing Bacteria'. Students developed a number of new aseptic skills that hopefully will show amazing results next lesson when we observe the bacteria growth on the petri dishes. Every student in the class arrived ready for learning with their formal leather shoes and listened carefully as the procedure was demonstrated to the group by our Science Technician. They then carefully set up their sterile space and carefully deposited their bacteria using a streak method. Petri dishes were then sealed and placed in the incubator to allow bacteria to multiply.

All groups followed instructions well and were able to complete the task to a high standard. They all worked well together to clean up before the end of the lesson. Well done everyone.



## School Based Youth Health Nurse (SBYHN)



Hello, my name is Fiona, and I am your School Based Youth Health Nurse.

As Youth Health Nurses are only based in State High Schools, many parents may not be familiar with my role. The Youth Health nurse facilitates a variety of initiatives to promote positive health and well-being at Pittsworth SHS.

I am an employee of Queensland Health, and service Pittsworth SHS four days per fortnight. I am a Registered General and Mental Health trained Nurse, with my service available to students, parents and staff of the school.

Within my role as Youth Health Nurse, there are some services I do not provide such as:

- treatment (ie. medications, injections, first aid)
- physical examinations
- ongoing counselling for psychological concerns

**What do I do? How can I help you?**

Fiona provides confidential support, guidance and advice, and generally just someone to talk to for students, their parents or staff members within the School. You can make an appointment to see Fiona in private to talk about issues which may be worrying you such as:

- mental health concerns;
- friendship issues; bullying;
- family breakdown;
- sexual health concerns;
- eating and nutrition issues;
- substance use;
- puberty and growing up;
- general health concerns or just simply to assist you to get in touch with the right external community service

Confidentiality is vitally important for young people seeking health information and advice. The SBYHN is a 'neutral person' within the school system, and as an employee of Queensland Health, adheres to a strict confidentiality policy which is discussed at the commencement of each appointment. The SBYHN does not require parental consent to offer a service to a young person.

**Do you need a referral?**

No referral is required. Just simply contact Fiona or the school to make an appointment.

**How do I make an appointment?**

Fiona is available every Monday and Tuesday. Students are able to make appointments themselves via the School Office. Alternatively, parents/carers are also able to make appointments with Fiona by phoning the School on 4619 8111.

**What other things does the School Youth Health Nurse do?**

- facilitates health promotion activities in school setting,
- facilitates the development of partnerships with relevant government and non-government agencies for health support and referral
- supports the development of a healthy school environment and ethos

**Where am I in the School?**

My office is located upstairs B Block in B1 co-located with the other School Support Staff. I am at the School every Monday and Tuesday and be contacted on these days by phoning 4619 8111.


The sessions cover firsthand stories from female apprentices and tradies, trades we offer, application process, testing and assessment requirements.
